Pray through the Journey—Life Group Questions—March 24, 2019

1. Share either one of your best or worst journeys. What made it what it was? How did you handle it?

2. Life is like a journey. Each one of us has a unique journey. It began with our birth and has numerous ups and downs. What part of your journey are you currently on? What do you need from God at this time?

3. Jesus had a difficult journey to take to Calvary. He understood fully what lay ahead for him. His life was saturated with prayer and the disciples saw this as critical to their own lives. What is your prayer life like? How might it be improved: frequency, right attitude, focus on right needs, greater degree of faith in prayer?

4. From Luke 11:9-10 seems to be a carte blanche promise for any prayer to be answered. We said that the context would prohibit that. In what way does the context restrict the application of these verses?

5. Read Luke 11:1-4. We spoke about God as Father in relationship, revering his Name, longing for his reign on earth, our physical needs, our need for forgiving others and being forgiven by God and prevention of temptation. Which of these do you need to pay attention to at this time in your life?

6. Read Luke 18:1-8. Jesus shares an example of a widow and unjust judge that won't fairly adjudicate this case. What is the message that God is making about prayer?
