1. What is one of your favorite things about Fall?
2. How would you describe yourself before you started following Jesus?
3. Have you ever lived somewhere where you knew you were an outsider?
4. The sermon emphasized that we are “made in the image of God”.
 - A. How are we different from other created things?
 - B. Being made in the image of God means that we have “a sense of eternity in our souls.” What does this mean to you?
5. Read 1 Corinthians 6:19-20. What do these verses say about your allegiance as a Jesus follower?
6. Read John 15:8-9 and Hebrews 11:13-16. What do you learn about your citizenship as a Jesus follower?
7. What are the main struggles for a Jesus follower, who has their citizenship in heaven, but for the time being, lives on earth?
8. In Colossians 3:1-2, we are told to set our minds on “things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.” What does this mean for you practically?
9. Read. Colossians 3:5-10.
 - A. Why does Paul use the following phrases: “Put to death...” (5) and “Get rid of...” (8)?
 - B. What do you notice about the specifics that are mentioned in Colossians 3:5-10?
 - C. What is one thing on this list that you need to “put to death” and “get rid of”?
