



Week 7 Discussion Guide

Reviewing the Message

Sunday's message talked about Jesus' letter to the church in Laodicea and why lukewarm Christianity is so serious. These questions will help us review the key ideas and biblical truths from Revelation 3:14–22.

1. According to the message, what does Jesus say about the spiritual condition of the church in Laodicea in Revelation 3:15–16?
 2. What does the term “**lukewarm Christianity**” mean in the context of this passage?
 3. Why did Jesus say the believers in Laodicea believed they were “rich” and “in need of nothing”?
 4. What five words does Jesus use in Revelation 3:17 to describe their true spiritual condition?
 5. What invitation does Jesus give in Revelation 3:20, and what does it reveal about His heart toward people who have grown distant from Him?

Connecting to the Message

Sunday's message challenged us to consider how comfort, success, and self-sufficiency can slowly lead to spiritual complacency. These questions help us think about how this message connects to our own experiences and spiritual lives.

6. Why do you think it is easy for believers to drift into “lukewarm” faith over time?
 7. In what ways can wealth, comfort, or busyness make it harder for people to depend on Jesus daily?
 8. What are some signs that someone’s relationship with Jesus might be becoming lukewarm?
 9. How does the culture we live in encourage self-sufficiency rather than dependence on God?
 10. Have you ever experienced a season where your faith felt lukewarm? What contributed to that season?

Applying the Message

Sunday’s message ultimately calls believers to respond - to turn from indifference and renew a close relationship with Jesus. These questions help us consider what actions we can take this week based on what God may be saying to us.

11. What is one area of your spiritual life where you sense God calling you to move from complacency to greater passion?
12. What practical habits (prayer, Scripture, worship, community, etc.) help keep your relationship with Jesus vibrant rather than lukewarm?
13. What might it look like for you personally to “open the door” to Jesus in a deeper way this week?
14. How can we encourage one another to stay spiritually engaged and dependent on Jesus?
15. What is one specific step you want to take this week in response to what God spoke to you through this message?
