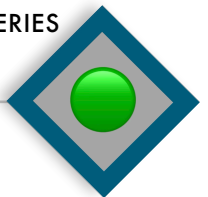

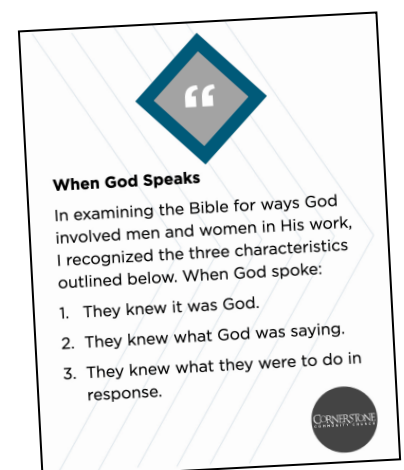
...regardless of your _____.

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.

– Romans 8:14 NIV

You are controlled by the Spirit if you have the Spirit of God living in you. (And remember that those who do not have the Spirit of Christ living in them do not belong to him at all.)

...They rushed at him and dragged him out of the city and began to stone him. His accusers took off their coats and laid them at the feet of a young man named Saul. – Acts 7:57-58 NLT

A great wave of persecution began that day, sweeping over the church in Jerusalem; and all the believers except the apostles were scattered through the regions of Judea and Samaria.

– Acts 8:1 NLT

Saul was going everywhere to destroy the church. He went from house to house, dragging out both men and women to throw them into prison. – Acts 8:3 NLT

Meanwhile, Saul was uttering threats with every breath and was eager to kill the Lord's followers. He requested letters addressed to the synagogues in Damascus, asking for their cooperation in the arrest of any followers of the Way he found there. – Acts 9:1-2a NLT

As he was approaching Damascus on this mission, a light from heaven suddenly shone down around him. – Acts 9:3 NLT

He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul! Saul! Why are you persecuting me?" – Acts 9:4 NLT

"Who are you, lord?" Saul asked. And the voice replied, "I am Jesus, the one you are persecuting! Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." – Acts 9:5-6 NLT

Now there was a believer in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord spoke to him in a vision, calling, "Ananias!"

"Yes, Lord!" he replied.

– Acts 9:10 NLT

The Lord said, "Go over to Straight Street, to the house of Judas. When you get there, ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul. He is praying to me right now. I have shown him a vision of a man named Ananias coming in and laying hands on him so he can see again." – Acts 9:11-12 NLT

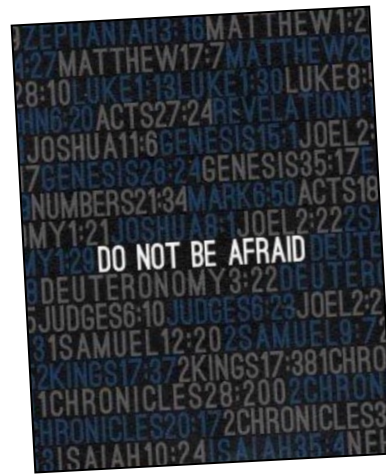
"But Lord," exclaimed Ananias, "I've heard many people talk about the terrible things this man has done to the believers in Jerusalem! – Acts 9:13 NLT

And he is authorized by the leading priests to arrest everyone who calls upon your name."

But the Lord said, "Go, for Saul is my chosen instrument to take my message to the Gentiles and to kings, as well as to the people of Israel.

– Acts 9:14 NLT



So Ananias went and found Saul. He laid his hands on him and said, "Brother Saul, Jesus, who appeared to you on the road, has sent me so that you might regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

– Acts 9:17 NLT

...because everyone needs a _____.

They were watching for him day and night at the city gate so they could murder him, but Saul was told about their plot. So during the night, some of the other believers lowered him in a large basket through an opening in the city wall.

– Acts 9:24-25 NLT

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem, he tried to meet with the believers, but they were all afraid of him. They did not believe he had truly become a believer! Then Barnabas brought him to the apostles... – Acts 9:26-27a NLT

He debated with some Greek-speaking Jews, but they tried to murder him. When the believers heard about this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him away to Tarsus, his hometown.

– Acts 9:29-30 NLT

Then Barnabas went on to Tarsus to look for Saul. When he found him, he brought him back to Antioch.

– Acts 11:25-26a NLT

While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." – Acts 13:2 NIV
