Text: Luke 8:4-18

Date: Sunday, May 18, 2025

- 1. The disciples didn't understand the meaning of the parable. Imagine for a moment that you didn't have the explanation from Jesus on this parable: Do you think you would have understood all Jesus meant by each symbol/element? What does this teach us about the nature of parables?
- 2. Parables seem difficult to understand for many. Why, then, does Jesus speak in parables?
- 3. How do parables "conceal"? How do parables "reveal"?
- 4. What does the seed represent in this parable?
- 5. Who is the sower in this parable?
- 6. Consider the soils. The first three soils remind us of the Christians' three enemies: the world, the flesh, the devil. In this way, how is "hearing God's Word" spiritual warfare?
- 7. What makes the "good soil" good? What's the evidence that the seed has been planted in good soil?
- 8. Why is it important that we "take care" how we hear? How do we do this?
- 9. How can you apply the teaching in this parable to your everyday life?
