Praying Inside a Fish

<u>7</u>"When my life was ebbing away, I remembered you, Lord,

and my prayer rose to you, to your holy temple.

<u>8</u>"Those who cling to worthless idols turn away from God's love for them.

<u>9</u>But I, with shouts of grateful praise, will sacrifice to you. What I have vowed I will make good.

I will say, 'Salvation comes from the Lord.' "

<u>10</u>And the Lord commanded the fish, and it vomited Jonah onto dry land. Jonah 2:7 – 10

When we find ourselves feeling trapped, we can turn to God.

<u>7</u>Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?

<u>8</u>*If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.*

<u>9</u>If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea,

<u>10</u>even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.

<u>11</u>If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me," <u>12</u>even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you. Psalm 139:7-12

Our interpretation of the situation often needs fresh revelation.

Ps. 73:16,17 <u>16</u>When I tried to understand all this, it troubled me deeply <u>17</u>till I entered the sanctuary of God; then I understood their final destiny.

Sometimes God saves us from being swallowed. And sometimes God allows us to be swallowed because he is about to save us.

When nobody is there to hear our cry, God hears us.

Jonah's prayers are not original.

God doesn't put a time limit on us.

God is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. 1Peter 3:9

Jonah is not saved because he remembered God. He's saved because the Lord remembered him.

v8 is Those who cling to worthless idols turn away from God's love for them.

Those who cling to worthless idols forfeit the grace that could be theirs.

Jonah's confinement gives him greater clarity to identify the idols.
