

John 3:14-22: The "In-Between Space"

Introduction

Jesus's crucifixion lifts us from darkness. This passage explores the "in-between space"—a liminal state between old beliefs and new truths. Nicodemus, a Jewish leader, is in this transitional state; Jesus calls us out of these uncertain transitions into eternal life.

Big Idea

Jesus guides us out of the in-between space.

Key Themes

- 1. Look to the Lifted One (14-15): As Israelites looked to the serpent for healing, we look to Jesus on the cross for salvation. His "lifting up" signifies both crucifixion and glorification.
- 2. Trust the Gifted One(16-18): God's immense love led Him to sacrifice His only Son so humanity wouldn't perish. This echoes Abraham's sacrifice. Our "perishing" and "condemned" state highlights the gospel's urgency.
- 3. Live for Lighted One (19-22): Jesus provides "light." Sinners avoid this light because it exposes their evil deeds. Worldviews can be shaped by a desire to justify behavior. Like insects drawn to light for navigation and safety, we should be attracted to God's light for guidance and refuge.

Conclusion:

Like Nicodemus, who eventually embraced Jesus, we are called to move out of the "in-between space" and into God's light, trusting in Him for salvation.
