DAY 1: Read Philippians 2:12-16

[12] Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; [13] for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure. [14] Do all things without complaining and disputing, [15] that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, [16] holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain.
Philippians 2:12-16 NKJV

- In verses 12-13, how would you describe the tension Paul addresses between salvation by works and salvation by grace?
- How does this address your life in Christ after experiencing His grace and mercy?

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DAY 3: Read Philippians 2:12-16

- The phrase "work out" means literally to work to full completion, like a miner or farmer.
- How does this speak to the practical position of our salvation?

DAY 4: Read Philippians 2:14

[14] Do everything without complaining and arguing,
Philippians 2:14 NLT

- Read verse 14. If Paul is writing from a place of joy, peace, patience, or faithfulness, why would Paul include this statement?
- How does obedience to God's Word intersect the maturity of the Fruit of the Spirit in our lives?

DAY 5: Read Philippians 2:14-15

[14] Do everything without complaining and arguing, [15] so that no one can criticize you. Live clean, innocent lives as children of God, shining like bright lights in a world full of crooked and perverse people.
Philippians 2:14-15 NLT

- Read verses 14-15. How does Paul link these two verses together for our good?
- Can you experience the life of verse 15 without living out verse 14?

Application:
