# ∞ Forgiveness is imperative ONE RNOTHER

The word Paul used in Colossians and Ephesians comes from a word that means "grace" or "favor."

- -- The act of giving freely or graciously, often without expectation of return
- -- This is the grace God extends to us

Jesus used a word in the parable that means "to send away; to release; to let go."

- -- The idea is one of releasing someone from a debt or an offense
- -- Forgiveness reflects a conscious decision to release someone from the burden of guilt or obligation that their offense against you has caused

When God forgives us, he no longer holds our sins against us, and he no longer condemns us because of our sin.

When we forgive someone, we no longer hold their sin against them for their condemnation, nor do we store their sin away in our mental filing cabinet with the intention of using it against them in the future.

When we extend forgiveness, we choose to lay down our right to have the one who sinned against us owe us.

Forgiveness is extending love and kindness even when it's undeserved, trusting that God will avenge our situation.
