- 1. Why do you think Luke includes these three verses that no other gospel does? Do you think there's a significance to these three verses coming after the story of the sinful woman who was forgiven? Why or why not?
- 2. Answer the three questions in section B in the notes: Who was with Him? Why were they with Him? What did they do?
- 3. What is the significance of Jesus having women disciples who were with Him and supporting the ministry?
- 4. Everyone has a past. As you reflect on your own life, how has Jesus healed, forgiven, and saved you? (Spend some time in prayer thanking Him for all He has done for you!)
- 5. What are some ways we (as individuals, as a small group, as a church, as Christians) can do a better job at heralding the good news of what Jesus has done?
- 6. What motivation do we see in God's Word for the generosity of God's people? What other Scripture passages inform your answer?
- 7. Reflection questions: Am I being a faithful announcer of the good news to those around me? Am I going out of my way to tell anyone the good news? Am I supporting others in the work they are doing announcing the good news? Am I being a faithful steward of what God has entrusted to me, giving faithfully and generously to the work of the gospel?
