1. Before Jesus, the Gentiles were living apart from God.

Ephesians 2:11–12 (NLT)¹¹Don't forget that you Gentiles used to be outsiders. You were called "uncircumcised heathens" by the Jews, who were proud of their circumcision, even though it affected only their bodies and not their hearts. ¹²In those days you were living apart from Christ

- A. The Gentiles were separated from Christ. Ephesians 2:12 (NLT) ¹²In those days you were living apart from Christ.
 - The Gentiles were not included at one time in all the blessings of the Israelites. • **Romans 9:4–5 (GW)** ⁴They are Israelites, God's adopted children. They have the Lord's glory, the pledges, Moses' Teachings, the true worship, and the promises. ⁵The Messiah is descended from their ancestors according to his human nature. The Messiah is God over everything, forever blessed. Amen.
- B. The Gentiles were excluded from citizenship
 - Ephesians 2:12 (NLT)¹²... You were excluded from citizenship among the people of Israel....
 - The person who was not born into the nation did not experience the blessings of citizenship. •
 - In the same way people today who are not citizens of this nation aren't able to experience the privileges of citizenship so the Gentiles did not have the privileges that the Israelites had as citizens.

- C. The Gentiles were excluded from the covenant promises. *Ephesians 2:12 (NLT)*¹²... you did not know the covenant promises God had made to them [Jews]....
- D. The Gentiles were without hope and without God. *Ephesians 2:12 (NLT)*¹²... You lived in this world without God and without hope.

2. Through Jesus the Gentiles were brought near to God.

Ephesians 2:13 (NLT) ¹³But now you have been united with Christ Jesus. Once you were far away from God, but now <u>you</u> [Gentiles] have been brought near to him through the blood of Christ.

- A. Christ brought spiritual peace with God to both Jew and Gentile. *Ephesians 2:14^a* (*NLT*) ¹⁴*For Christ himself has brought peace to us.*
 - Reconciled meant to bring together again.
- B. Christ brought relational peace between the Jews and Gentiles making them into one new people. Ephesians 2:14–16 (NLT) ¹⁴... He united Jews and Gentiles into <u>one people</u> when, in his own body on the cross, he broke down <u>the wall of hostility</u> that separated us. ¹⁵He did this by ending the system of law with its commandments and regulations. He made peace between Jews and Gentiles by <u>creating in himself one new people from the two groups</u>. ¹⁶Together as one body, Christ reconciled both groups to God by means of his death on the cross, and our hostility toward each other was put to death.
 - The wall of hostility is an allusion to the soreg, a dividing wall in the Temple that kept distance between the Gentiles and the Holy Place.
 - Inscription: "No foreigner may enter within the barricade which surrounds the sanctuary and enclosure. Anyone who is caught doing so will have himself to blame for his ensuing death."



- C. Christ clarified and unified the way to the Father for everyone. *Ephesians 2:18 (NLT)* ¹⁸Now all of us can come to the Father through <u>the same Holy Spirit</u> because of what Christ has done for us.
 - Now, Jews and Gentiles connect to the Father through Jesus, and no other way! John 14:6 (NLT) ⁶Jesus told him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me.

3. Through Jesus, Jews and Gentiles have become One.

A. The Jews and Gentiles are now one nation. Ephesians 2:19 (NLT) ¹⁹So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners. You are citizens along with all of God's holy people

Matthew 21:43 (NLT) ⁴³I tell you, the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a nation that will produce the proper fruit.

- B. The Jews and Gentiles are now one family. *Ephesians 2:19 (NLT)* ¹⁹So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners . . . <u>You are members of God's family.</u>
- C. The Gentiles are now part of one church with all its benefits. *Ephesians 2:20–22 (NLT)*²⁰Together, we are his house, built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets. And the cornerstone is Christ Jesus himself. ²¹We are carefully joined together in him, becoming a holy temple for the Lord. ²²Through him you Gentiles are also being made part of this dwelling where God lives by his Spirit.
