The Real Transformative Work of God Genesis 32:6-12, 24-31

Objective: To learn how we, as Jacob, can experience the real transformative work of God in our lives.

Internal transformation is a work of God.

Only when submitting to <u>God's process</u> for transformation can a person experience the real transformative work of God in their life.

God's process of real transformation always includes:

- I. A <u>real relationship</u> that's been <u>extended</u> to us by God (vv. 6-12).
 - A. Jacob's fear (vv. 6-7a).
 - B. Jacob's initial reaction is to strategize (vv. 7b-8).
 - C. Jacob's humble prayer (vv. 9-11).

Evidence of spiritual maturity will always be made manifest in the real outward maturity of a person.

D. Jacob's Model of prayer: I'm afraid...but You said... (vs. 12).

God's <u>process</u> of <u>real transformation</u> always includes:

- II. A <u>real encounter</u> that's been <u>initiated</u> with us by God (vv. 24-26).
 - A. A <u>Man</u> wrestled with him **(vs. 24).** God makes the first move.
 - B. Jacob, a life of wrestling (vv. 25-26).

Luke 9:23-24 • 23 And he said to all, "If anyone would come after me, <u>let him deny himself</u> and <u>take up his cross daily</u> and follow me. 24 For whoever would <u>save his life</u> <u>will lose it</u>, but whoever <u>loses his</u> life for my sake will save it.

The Bible shows us repeatedly that true victory comes after submission to God, not in struggle.

God's process of real transformation always includes:

III. A real name change that's been given to us by God (vv. 27-30).

- A. No longer Jacob "Heel Grabber" (vv. 27-28a).
- B. But Israel "God prevails" (vv. 28b-30).

True victory comes once I, like Jacob, submit myself to the truth that <u>God prevails</u>... not me.

- C. The consequences of Jacob living in a former identity.
 - Examine the consequences in Jacob's sons.
 - Delayed devotion will be caught by those around you.
 - What kind of legacy are you leaving behind?

God's process of real transformation always includes:

IV. A <u>real limp</u> that's been <u>given</u> to us by God (vs. 31).

"It is doubtful whether God can bless a man greatly until He has hurt him deeply." - A.W. Tozer

- A. A real encounter with God changes your walk (vs. 31).
- B. Those who are in Christ can be identified by their walk.
- **2 Corinthians 5:17** Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.
