Worship at Zion

The Zion worship service has a structure and sequence that reflects the way scripture shows how God meets his people. God has made himself known to the world in Jesus Christ, who is God the Son, who took on human flesh, bled and died for our sins, rose from the dead, ascended to the Father's right hand, intercedes for us now, and will come again to receive us at the end. The church assembles on the Lord's day to name the name of Jesus, which is above every name.

- We enter his courts with thanksgiving and praise
- We kneel before him in confession and repentance
- We stand and hear again the Gospel's promise of mercy and forgiveness
- We bring our tribute offerings to our King
- We hear the voice of God from scripture
- We eat at the table Jesus has provided for us
- We depart with his blessing and promise that He will be with us until he comes for us again.

Church on Mission "Opposing God" Acts 5:30-42 (pew Bible p. 913-914) Sermon Notes: 5 November

Big Idea: Because Christians cling to the gospel, we must consider how we live out the gospel. Problem: People face outside opposition as we work to live out our values.

Christians must consider how they live out the gospel in:

I. How They Speak (vv. 30-33)

II. How They Reason (vv. 34-39a)

III. How They See Themselves (vv. 39b-42)

Acts 5:30-42

30 The God of our fathers raised Jesus, whom you killed by hanging him on a tree. 31 God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. 32 And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him."

33 When they heard this, they were enraged and wanted to kill them. 34 But a Pharisee in the council named Gamaliel, a teacher of the law held in honor by all the people, stood up and gave orders to put the men outside for a little while. 35 And he said to them, "Men of Israel, take care what you are about to do with these men. 36 For before these days Theudas rose up, claiming to be somebody, and a number of men, about four hundred, joined him. He was killed, and all who followed him were dispersed and came to nothing. 37 After him Judas the Galilean rose up in the days of the census and drew away some of the people after him. He too perished, and all who followed him were scattered. 38 So in the present case I tell you, keep away from these men and let them alone, for if this plan or this undertaking is of man, it will fail; 39 but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them. You might even be found opposing God!" So they took his advice, 40 and when they had called in the apostles, they beat them and charged them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.

41 Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name. 42 And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they did not cease teaching and preaching that the Christ is Jesus.

Questions for Reflection

- What do the pronouns we, our, you, and those show us about this presentation of the gospel in vv. 30-32? Who is speaking to whom? Where is there togetherness? Where is there separateness? How can Christians today learn from this and apply it to their own presentation of the gospel?
- Gamaliel gives a sort of principle in vv. 38-39. How would you summarize it? Is it always true? How could it be true in the long term, but seemingly untrue in the short term?
- Have you ever counted yourself "worthy to suffer dishonor" for something? What was it? How does it compare to suffering dishonor for presenting the gospel?
