Read Isaiah 61:1-11

Why do you think Jesus responded to them the way he did? (Lk. 4:23-27)

How do people generally respond to the words of Jesus today?

Would you say it is easier or harder to believe Jesus is the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy today or that day in Nazareth when Jesus declared "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."? Why do you answer the way you do?

Does reading the Old Testament help you understand Jesus' ministry? Why or why not?

How could the good news help you grow to be "oaks of righteousness...that he may be glorified"?

Why is it important to hear both law and gospel?

What have you noticed about Isaiah's prophecies as this series has progressed?

Is the message different? If so, how? If not, why?

How can you let Scripture be your "source and norm for life"?
