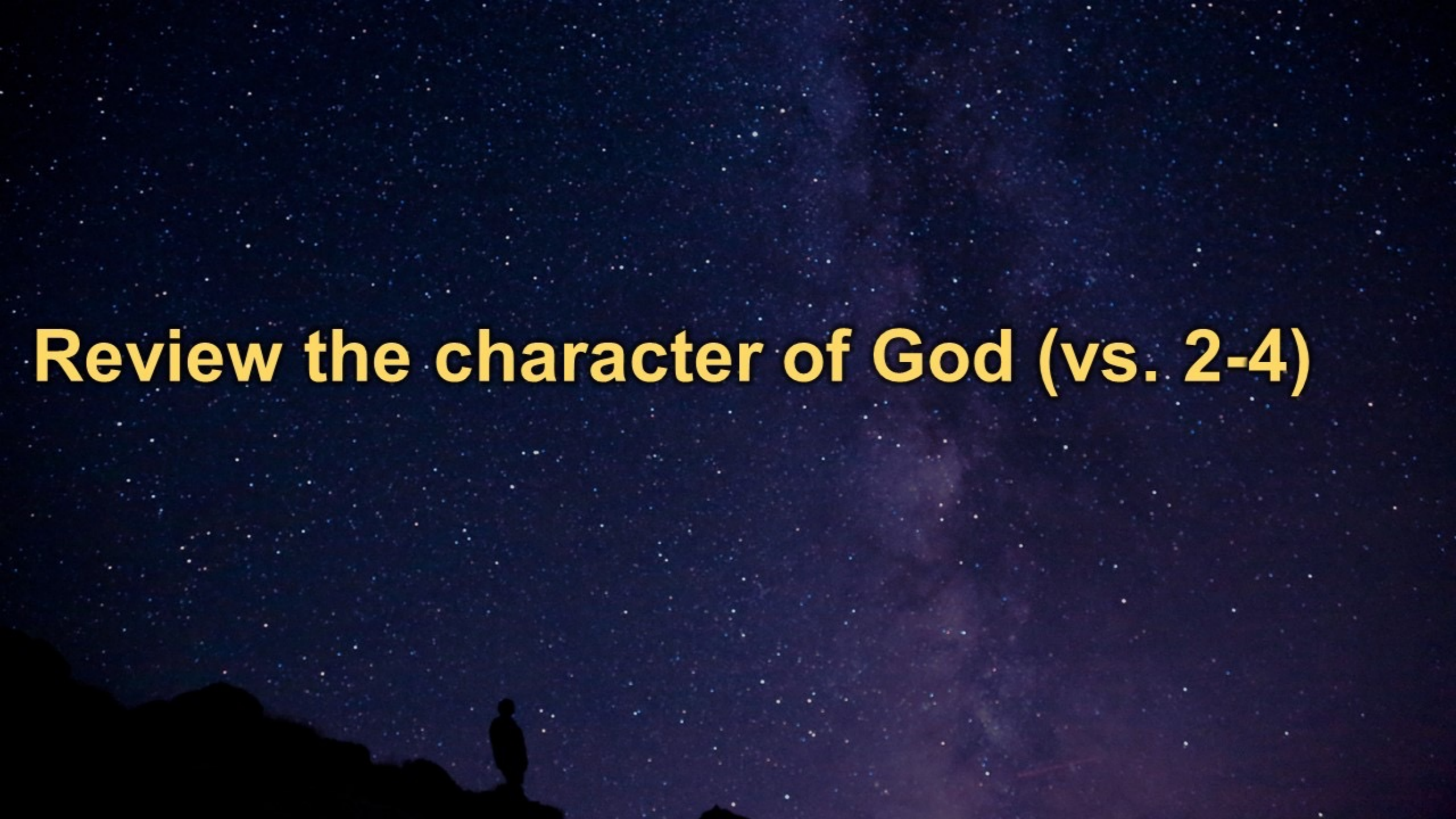

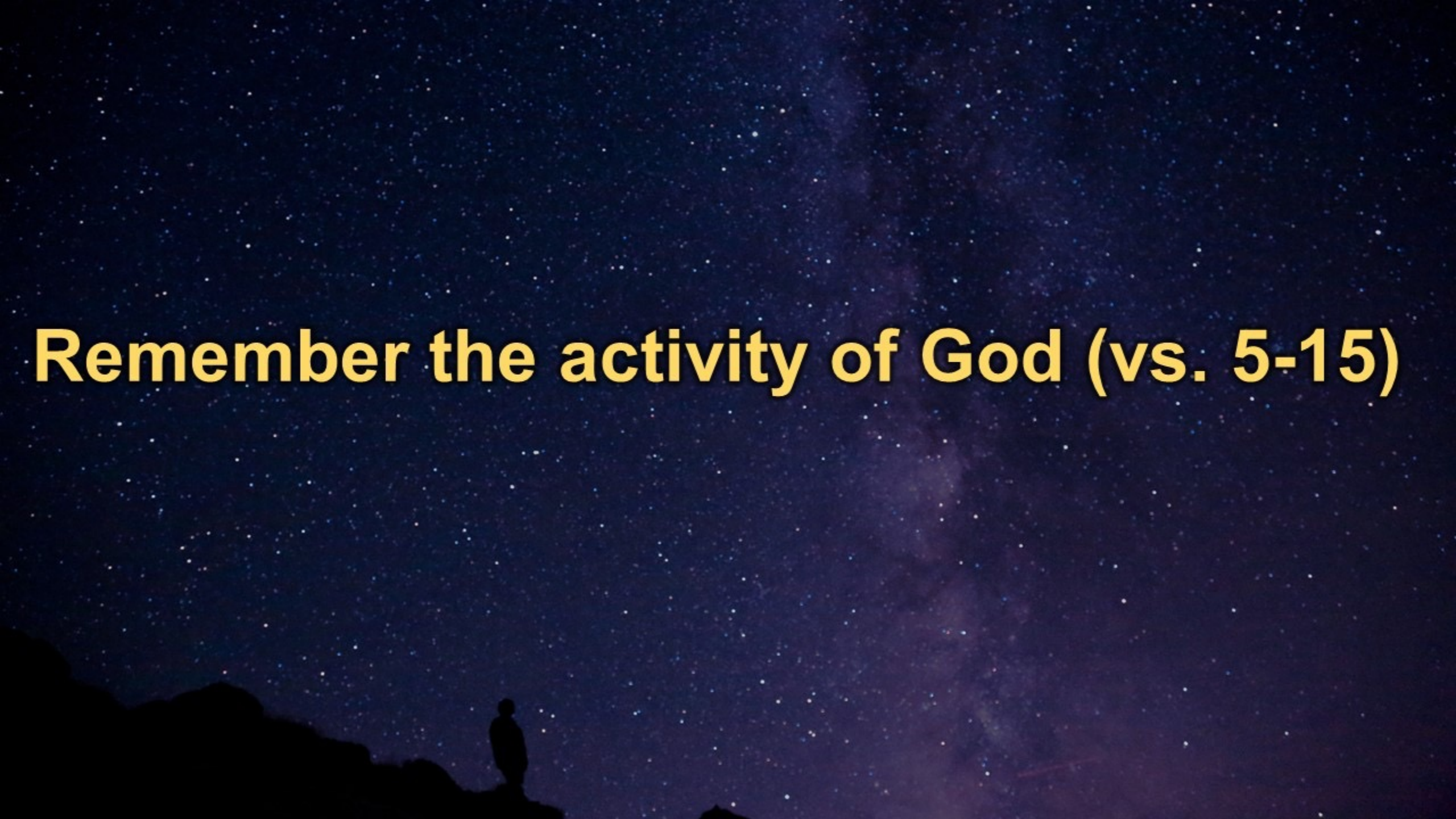
When Your Pain Prevents Your Praise
