Introduction

Pastor Scott walked us through what the resurrection means; not just as a historical event, but as a present reality that shapes how we live today. Because Jesus lives, we don't have to be defined by fear, defeat, or uncertainty. Instead, we can live with confidence, walk with courage, and stand with hope every day.

Reflecting on the Passage

- In [Mark 16:6](#), why do you think the angel begins with "Don't be alarmed"? What does that reveal about the moment?
- How does [Revelation 1:18](#) describe Jesus' authority over death, and why is that significant for believers?
- How does [1 Corinthians 15:55-57](#) describe the victory believers have through Jesus' resurrection?

Personal Application

- What does it mean for you personally to live with confidence because Jesus is alive?
- Where in your life do you need courage to face fear, uncertainty, or difficulty?
- When life feels overwhelming, how does the truth of the resurrection help you hold onto hope?

Exploring Faith

- Robert Flatt said the resurrection gives us “the opportunity to start over.” How have you experienced new beginnings through Christ?
- Billy Graham said, “Because He lives, we can face tomorrow.” Why does the resurrection give us confidence about the future?
- Max Lucado reminds us that Easter declares that love and peace will ultimately prevail. How does that shape your perspective on the world today?

Community Impact

- How might God be calling you to share the hope of the resurrection with someone who feels discouraged or defeated?
- How can we encourage one another to trust in God’s promises, even in difficult seasons?
- In what ways can we reflect the living presence of Jesus in our daily interactions?

Closing Thoughts

The resurrection is more than a moment in history; it’s the foundation of our faith and the power for our present lives.

Because Jesus lives:

- We can live with confidence knowing death is defeated.
- We can walk with courage no matter what we face.
- We can stand with hope that God’s promises will prevail.

The empty tomb is not the end of the story. It’s the beginning of a new way to live.

He lives... so we can too.
