Big Idea: What is not **intentionally transferred** is usually **accidentally lost**.

Key Line: Every generation passes something on to the next.

The 5 Shared Goals for a Legacy

“I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.” — **John 10:10**

- **1. Spiritual Health:** Moving past shallow religion into a real **relationship with Jesus**.
- **2. Emotional & Physical Wellbeing:** Learning that true strength requires **presence and availability**.
- **3. Relationships:** Keeping families connected; discipleship must move **beyond Sunday**.
- **4. Purpose:** Teaching children **why they are alive**, not just how to make a living.
- **5. Stewardship:** Realizing that stewardship determines whether our handoff **grows or collapses**.

The 4 Legacies We Leave

1. Every Generation Inherits Something

- Nobody starts from scratch. We transfer beliefs, wounds, habits, and faith.
- **The Shema (Deut. 6:4-7):** Faith isn't a single lesson; it is the **entire curriculum** of your daily life.

2. Every Generation Must Choose What to Keep

- Israel inherited the Promised Land but forgot the God who gave it. They held onto the blessing but let go of the **Blessor**.

3. Every Generation Must Intentionally Transfer Faith

- The next generation doesn't need perfect fathers; they need **present, authentic** believers.

4. Every Generation Eventually Hands Off the Baton

- No generation leads forever. The goal is not control; the goal is **transfer**.

My Championship Strategy

1. **Strengthen** my personal relationship with the Lord first.
2. **Engage** my family intentionally through daily prayer and scripture.
3. **Model** authentic faith and repentance rather than empty performance.
