REFLECTION + DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What “deeds of the Lord” come to your mind when you think about the faithfulness of God in your life?
2. How can remembering what God has done in the past help a person deal with fear or uncertainty in the present?
3. How does Habakkuk’s decision to rejoice (“*yet I will rejoice*”) challenge and/or encourage you?
4. What does it look like practically to find joy in the Lord even when things don’t make sense to you?
5. What does chapter 3 teach you about what it means to worship the Lord in hard times?
6. Has there ever been a time in your life when you felt like Habakkuk – terrified, yet determined to trust? What did you learn?
7. What does verse 16 reveal about the tension between fear and faith?
8. What would change if you anchored your joy in God rather than in your circumstances?
9. In verse 19, Habakkuk rejoices that the Lord makes his feet like the feet of a deer. What does this metaphor teach us about how God equips us to endure?
10. Is there an area of your life where God is inviting you to say, “*Even though... yet I will rejoice*”?
